I'm Ready for Some Fun!

For those who don't know, I broke my ankle at All-Region Work Weekend at Wonderland Camp. I was gathering fallen limbs in the forest, when I stepped in a leaf-covered hole. My ankle snapped to the left, then to the right. I went to the hospital at the Lake and they said I had a good break, put a splint on my leg and sent me home with directions to see an orthopedic doctor when I returned to Columbia. I spent the rest of the day that Saturday at Camp, trying to socialize in between naps and pain killers. I headed for home shortly after dinner. As I got home, my teeth started chattering and I was shaking all over. The tips of my fingers and toes went numb. I felt a warm rush coming up through my chest. I got scared as my temperature grew from 100.2 to 101.8 within an hour. Fearing I was having a reaction to the pain medication, I went back to the hospital. They told me I had bronchitis and would need to take 10 days of antibiotic. Strange that I happened to get bronchitis the same time as my broken ankle. I spent the next day and a half battling the fever, going through a different shirt every hour, drenched with sweat.

The fever broke Monday morning and I went to see an orthopedic doctor for my ankle. He explained that the first break to my ankle had caused the bones to shift and a steel plate would need to be inserted to bring them back into place and for them to heal properly. He set up my surgery for that next day. I complained about the crutches hurting my hands and armpits. He suggested I get a

walker. I went to my local pharmacy and checked out the walkers. There was one I wanted that had a seat on it. They told me it probably wouldn't be covered by insurance, but they would check. While they did that, I asked if Bill Morrissey was working that day, a Columbia Jaycee friend of mine. He was there and I told him my tale. He said "what you need is one of these." He went over and grabbed a scooter looking contraption and wheeled it around the store. It has a shelf where you put your knee and you use your good leg to push yourself around. I told him I'd love to use it, but didn't know if my insurance would cover it. He took it to the register and said "get her information...this one's on me." Yet another example of when it helps to have your Jaycee friends!

It is now a week later and I'm back to work. I haven't gotten permission to drive yet, but expect to in about a week. Meanwhile, I'm relying on friends and family to get me to where I need to be. I wanted to take this opportunity to thank everyone that helped me that day and since. Big thanks to Paul Myers for taking me to the hospital. Others who helped me that day were Michelle Emmerich, Lorie Thompson and Cara Harms. Thanks also to all the well wishes I have received from Jaycees all over the state. It's times like these that you really find out who your true friends are.

I am ready to have fun later this month at May meeting. I hope you are all planning to attend! We have Jaycee Idol on Friday, some awesome training on Saturday and the Senate is hosting the Wacky Olympics on Saturday afternoon...sure to be a good time, I'm sure. Looking forward to Jaycee friendship and fun in Macon!

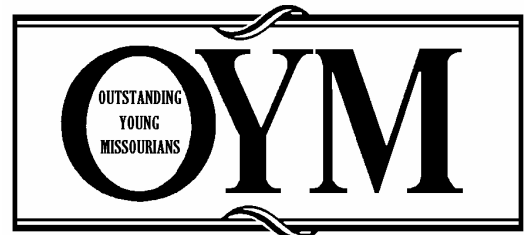

Early Renewal Dues Rebate Offered!

Renewal Dues for 2007 are \$53.00, which is the same as dues for new members. **HOWEVER...** chapters who submit their renewals (with payment or open check on file) by the posted closeout deadlines will receive a rebate credit of \$5 per renewal. CPG Book Judging Scheduled at May State Meeting

Chapters are encouraged to put together some CPG Books from your 1st Period projects and bring the books to the May State Meeting for competition. This is how you get your outstanding projects and project chairpersons recognized at the state level. You're already running great projects, so finish the paperwork and get your people recognized for their hard work!!!

This year, all chapters that submit CPG Books must also provide at least one person to judge for every three (3) books submitted. The Missouri JCI Senate will be on hand to help judge as well and to help "train" the new chapter judges on how to grade the books.

CPG Book Judging will be done on Friday night, May 18th at the Spring State Meeting starting at 10:30 PM. Judges should bring their books with them -do NOT mail them to the State Service Center! Please check-in at the Registration Table to find out what room the book judging will take place.

There is NO COST to submit project books for state judging, and you can submit as many books as you wish. Your chapter can also receive substantial POC points for submitting CPG books (up to 500 points per trimester!). Your CPG Project Books are also a valuable tool to be passed onto next year's chairperson to help them get started and make the project even more successful in year's to come.

Our judges will pay close attention to each book to ensure that it's submitted in the proper format. CPG Books are quite easy to put together by following a few simple guidelines. Information on the Areas of Opportunities, guidelines for completing the CPG and rules for single project entries are all spelled out in the US Jaycees Awards Manual.

CPG Books that are submitted for judging at the May State Meeting that do not conform to the US Jaycees guidelines will NOT be judged and the chapter will not receive any POC credit for improperly formatted CPG Books! We appreciate the continuing help of the Missouri JCI Senate, as they provide Senator book judges for us at every state meeting. It's important that all books are formatted properly so the judges can focus on the content and the overall impact of the project and are able to make constructive suggestions on how to improve the books for year-end judging!
